S.O.S Reading Strategies



Go exploring in a good book and discover all the wonderful things that you can learn from reading! To help students enjoy reading, one strategy that establishes a deep understanding is Wilson Comprehension S.O.S (Stop - Orient - Scaffold / Support). While engaging in various reading activities, students are encouraged to actively create a mental movie in their mind and participate in thoughtful, meaningful literacy based discussions.

This helps students to become immersed in literature and think while reading. Comprehension S.O.S encourages students to get caught up in a story and establish long lasting, effective reading habits!

Walt Whitman is Cyber-Smart-Internet Safety is Priority Number ONE!



Internet Safety has been the focus for grades 3-5 in Library/Computer. Students are learning about various strategies to stay safe while using the computer. They learn that key guidelines are to ask parents for assistance and not to give out any personal information. Students also are reminded to create strong passwords and not to share

them with anyone except their parents. Classes have watched BrainPop to obtain facts and then created graphic organizers and Power Point presentations on the computer to highlight their knowledge. They also have answered review questions using the Mimio Vote assessment tool. Children are excited to see the class answers represented in a circle graph.
