#### **Audience to the Public**

The Syosset Board of Education consists of nine members, each elected by the registered voters of the Syosset Central School District, Town of Oyster Bay, for three-year terms, serving without pay. The Board, representing residents of the District, is the legislative and policy-making body responsible for all regulations governing public education within District schools. The Board of Education delegates the overall management of these policies to the Superintendent of Schools as its Chief Executive Officer. The Superintendent may, in turn, further delegate authority.

The Syosset Board of Education and Administration welcome your attendance at Board of Education meetings. All meetings are open to the public, as required by the New York State Open Meetings Law. The exception being Executive sessions, during which items such as collective bargaining negotiations, personnel matters, confidential student matters, or legal matters may be discussed.

The Board and Administration recognize the value of community participation. As such, audience to the public affords residents of the district the opportunity to address the Board. The School Board encourages public participation and is attentive to opinions and concerns.

For those community members in attendance who may not be familiar with the procedures of public Board Meetings, several general guidelines will apply. Those who wish to speak during audience to the public must first be recognized by the chair. Residents may address the Board of Education, only after entering their full name and address in the official register available in the rear of the Auditorium. Those speaking initially will be limited to four minutes of speaking time. No speaker may readdress the Board until every audience member who wishes to be heard has had the opportunity to speak. In order that those wishing to speak, have an equal

opportunity to address the Board, under no circumstances will comments be recognized, nor responded to, from those seated in the audience. In addition, derogatory comments of a personal nature directed at any member of the Board, Administration or District Personnel will not be tolerated under any circumstances. Comments relating to the interaction among Board Members during the Public Meeting will not be recognized, nor receive a response.

All speakers will demonstrate civility and respect towards others. Complaints directed at school personnel or students may not be expressed during the open meeting. Such concerns must be submitted in writing to the Board.

We believe that effective dialogue can only occur if an atmosphere of mutual respect is maintained. We invite members of the public to share this commitment with the Board and respectfully request that anyone wishing to address the board during "Audience to the Public" read the preceding guidelines.

Persons who record or photograph the proceedings during a meeting may not distract or obstruct the meeting participants by their movement or with their equipment. They may not move about the room for the purpose of recording people's faces and may not position themselves directly in front of the school officials at the dais so as to obscure their view of the public and the public's view of the school officials. Cameras and recording devices should be placed and used in a stationary location, behind or apart from those in attendance in a manner that does not impair or obstruct any person's ability to view or hear the proceedings or the members of the public.

Requests for specific information are best handled by direct communication with the individual administrator or teacher responsible for that area. Due to individual's rights of privacy, we do not discuss employees or students in public. Asking detailed questions at a Board Meeting sometimes does not allow for the review of information necessary to insure that the response given is accurate and does in fact answer the question. Any questions that can be responded to will be addressed after all have finished speaking.
